Save those Box Tops and Soup Labels

Looking for a an easy way to help raise money for Cordley? Here a few ways you can help.



Box Tops When you purchase an item that has a Box Top

for Education on it, cut off the Box Top and save it. Turn in Box Tops in the Campbell Soup can in the front of the school or send them to school with your child. You may be surprised how many you can collect once you start noticing them on products you already buy. The box tops are collected, counted and sent in. Then, the school is sent checks twice a year.



Campbell Soup Labels When you purchase any Camp-

bell Soup brand item, clip off the little box that tells how many points the item is worth. Turn in the labels in the Campbell Soup can in the front of the school or send them to school with your child. The labels are counted and sent in. We are Looking for Some Helpful Hawks

Dear Cordley Parents,

At the October PTA meeting we had a lengthy discussion about the increasing numbers of families dealing with ever increasing financial



burdens. Cordley families have always been incredibly generous in support of our greater Cordley family – the Holiday Family Project, scholarships for clubs, carnival passes, silent auction donations, Farm to School, and teacher wish lists to name a few examples. Cordley is home to an amazing combination of dedicated and caring parents, teachers, staff, and kids and personally, I am thankful everyday to be part of Cordley.

Back to the Helping Hawks. The Cordley PTA would like to organize a list of go-to families willing to donate needed items. Such a list would be modeled after two groups here in Lawrence, the Lawrence Elves and 100 Good Women. These generous individuals give anonymously when requests come from school staff and teachers for things like shoes, baby supplies, clothes, toiletries, etc. These two groups help with requests that come from all of our schools in Lawrence and there are many such requests these days.

Here at Cordley, it is difficult for the PTA to donate funds towards and then shop for multiple, small-scale needs that come up suddenly as we have a set budget and need to vote on expenditures. So, if we were to have a list of families willing to share in giving when needs arise, it would be a more effective way of handling these requests.

How it could work. Requests for needed items would come through, and only through, our Counselor and Social Worker Catherine Bolton. Requests from Ms. Bolton would go out to an anonymous list of donors. No requests for cash will be made. Once someone has agreed to fulfill the need, the rest of the list of donors will be notified. Families receiving the donation will also remain anonymous. For example – A request comes into your email box for socks along with a number identifying the request. You happen to be going to Target that day. You let Ms. Bolton know that you will purchase the socks and deliver them to the school office with the assigned number attached.

Requests for aid will still go out to the citywide groups, but a system of Helping Hawks here at Cordley helps us share in support of our Cordley kids.
